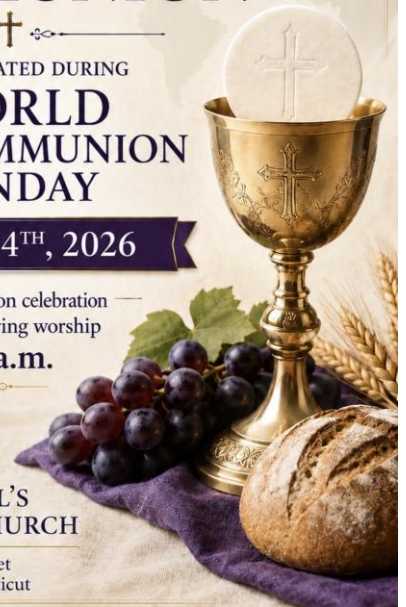

Amen.
