A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

With September we begin a new program year. Sunday School resumes as a major part of our overall mission to teach and promote the Christian faith. We salute our teachers and the parents who commit to bringing their children to the classes.

We will also resume communion at the rail. We'll still use intinction, rather than drinking from a common cup, but those who are able can kneel at the rail as was once the norm here.

All these are designed to enhance our overall sense of community and open up more opportunities for spiritual growth. We welcome all ideas in this direction, and your honest responses to them.

FROM FINANCE

Dear Brother and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter the final four months of the year, there are several important projects and plans underway that will shape our financial outlook moving forward.

♦ 2026 Budgets

Committees are asked to submit their 2026 budget requests to the bookkeeper (bookkeeper@stpaulstorrington.com) no later than October 17th. This timeline ensures Margaret has time to compile all requests for review by the Finance Committee, which will then present the proposed budget to the Church Council in November.

☼ Solar & Roof Project

We are excited to share that the solar and roof project was officially approved during the special congregational meeting on Wednesday, August 20th. The Finance Committee is now gathering the necessary information to secure financing so that this project can move forward.

MAC Replacement

The replacement of the HVAC unit above the office has also been approved. While funds are available from investments if needed, our hope is to launch a capital campaign to cover the full cost. The project bid came in at \$18,450, and we would like to raise \$20,000 to provide a buffer for any unexpected expenses. By purchasing the unit now, we can lock in the current price and have it stored by the contractor until installation.

I again want to take a moment to clarify the deficit shown on the weekly slide. The figure you see only reflects the contributions received through Sunday mornings offerings, bank EFTs, and Vanco payments. It does not includes income from the cell tower, parking lot, fundraisers, use of facilities, or other special gifts. These additional resources of income have allowed us to avoid drawing from our investments. Ideally, however, our goal is to cover regular expenses through Sunday giving, so that these other income streams can remain available for repairs, improvements, and unexpected needs.

When asked how we expect people to give more on Sunday mornings, my response is this: giving is a deeply personal matter. Each of us must prayerfully consider before the Lord what we are able and willing to give. Ultimately, it is a decision made between the individual and God.




HILLTOP ELC



WHAT? September already! Where has the time gone? Our September enrollment is slightly lower than that of last year. Currently, we have 46 students enrolled.

We will continue to have a full-day classroom for Hilltop. We are offering a full day option to the three-year-old class as well. There are several combinations of full and ½ day students enrolled. This classroom meets 9:15-2:45 or 9:15-11:45 each day and has 14 students enrolled. This year is the



year with many three-year-olds. The MWF 3's meet from 9:30-12:00 or 9:30-2:45 and has 18 students enrolled. The 2's class currently has 6 students. Please spread the word that we have available spaces in the 2's class. They meet on Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30-11:30. The Early Start CT (formerly School Readiness) funded classroom has 10 of 14 spaces full. Please say a prayer that we get the other four students because our budget depends very much on that income. We are grateful for any referrals you can offer to your friends and family for Hilltop.

We know that the Lord has been with us and continues to watch over our program and gives us the will and determination to make it work!

We have hired two new teachers for this school year after the retirement of Mrs. Valente and Mrs. Brzoska. We send them well wishes towards their new adventures. Ms. Sears has relocated to another town and is too far away to make the commute. Ms. Brianna Ausen and Ms. Amy Werner will join the Hilltop team this fall. We have changed the staff positions to best suit our situation with unfamiliar staff coming on board. All staff will return on August 25th to prepare their classes and curriculum. The school year will begin September 2nd. Parent Orientation will be on August 28th at 6:30 p.m. After my presentation, the families will have time to visit the child's classroom. Visiting days begin September 2nd. I am excited to welcome the staff, children, and their families to Hilltop in September!

Thank you to everyone who continues to help me navigate my position here at Hilltop. Now in my fifth year! I wish to recognize the Hilltop Advisory Committee, especially Pamela Little, for continuing to meet via ZOOM each month and throughout the summer. They have been faithful, and supportive, they continue to want ONLY the best for the Hilltop ministry that St. Paul's offers this community! Others from the church community that have been so supportive and helpful to me are Rachel, Margaret, Diane and Ralph Boscarino Philip Weingart and Casaundra Abeling.

Over the summer Hilltop became fully integrated with the Torrington Police Department with our security cameras. They now have 24/7 access in case of an emergency.

We will need Hilltop's Helping Hands parent group now more than ever to help us find ways to support Hilltop. We will start the year off with a "spice" fundraiser and hope you will support us! More information is forthcoming. Tentatively the date of the sale will be Mid-October through the end of the month. Delivery is planned before Thanksgiving so

you can start your "Holiday Baking." For the first time since I've been the director, Hilltop will participate in the Annual Craft Fair. Our table will be called "Festival of Bags." It's basically a grab bag. The cost is \$2.00 per chance. We are asking for your help to fill the bags with small toys, art supplies and such. The list is below.











SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHER/HELPERS NEEDED

FIRST COMMUNION CLASSES

Most children are baptized as infants or toddlers; that is the First Sacrament, recognized by the Lutheran church. The Second Sacrament is that of Holy Communion. Here at St. Paul's we typically offer First Communion classes to third and fourth graders. On Saturday, September 20th, four young people and their parent(s) will gather from 9am – 12pm for instruction and then on Sunday, October 5th, they will join countless of other Christians who will celebrate World Communion Sunday. God will welcome Camden, Jonas, Ripley, and Tyler to the table for the first time.







"ADOPT A CHILD FOR SUNDAY SCHOOL"

Children from baptism to grade nine and beyond are educated here at St. Paul's. As soon as a child is baptized the parent(s) are sent quarterly reminders/remembrances of the baptismal promises made on their child's behalf. When a child turns three it is time to enroll in Sunday School and it is there that they learn that Jesus loves them and they learn to pray a prayer. By the time children reach second grade they are invited to take First Communion classes and become Communicant members of the church. By fourth grade they take another giant step as they begin serving as acolytes in worship. By the time children enter seventh grade, they begin a three-year confirmation program where they prepare for adult membership in the church. The first two years of confirmation focus on the Old Testament, the New Testament, and Luther's Small Catechism; by the third year of confirmation classes the students are putting their faith into action through service, witness, and churchmanship projects. We also hope to be able to get an active youth group going for youth in grades 7-12.

All of these activities cost money, as you are aware. Our church budget supports our efforts and we ask for a donation from parents to help cover some of the costs associated with their child's Christian Education but those contributions only begin to cover expenses. (With curriculum, Bibles in Kindergarten, third grade, and seventh grade, classroom and teaching supplies, pageant expenses, etc. the numbers really add up.) No child would ever be denied a Christian Education because of the inability to make a donation; all are welcome to learn/hear the Word of the Lord! With the church budget continually strained, we invite you to lend your financial support by Adopting a Child for Sunday School. 




