## **Stewardship Thoughts from the Pastor**

I believe that many members of St. Paul's sometimes feel like you wish you were able to give more in offerings, but things seem so tight, it's hard to see how.

I know this feeling. In my young adult days, money was very tight, yet I wanted to support my church more than I was. Out of that desire, I did develop a few strategies that worked for me as I grew in my understanding of stewardship as a joyful response to all the blessings God had poured upon me.

I'll use hypothetical numbers for some of these suggestions, but you'll easily see how they can work in your own specific situation.

One method I tried that turned out to be pretty easy is this: each week when I wrote the check for my regular offering, I also wrote a smaller one and put it in a jar. So if my offering was \$20, I'd write a second check for maybe \$5 and put it in the jar. I would do this for 6 or 8 weeks in a row. If everything was going well, and I was not missing those smaller checks, I'd take them to the church. In this example, my weekly offering increased by 25% without any stress on my budget. On the other hand, if I ran into some unexpected expense during those weeks, I'd have that jar to help me address it. The other cool thing about this method is that you have a kind of cushion if you happen to accidentally overdraw your account, while those uncashed checks are in the jar.

Another version of this that worked for me at another time is this: Let's say my weekly offering was \$20 (remember, this was decades ago and I had very limited income.) When the next Sunday came, I gave \$21. I didn't miss that extra dollar. So the next Sunday I gave \$22. Still didn't miss the extra dollar. I kept adding \$1 each week for several weeks until it started to put stress on my budget. By that time I'd increased my weekly giving many percentages without any struggle.

Yet another way is simply to put any loose change you have at the end of each day in a jar. After some weeks you can take the change to the bank to exchange for paper cash and put it in your offering.

There is also the "windfall" method. Many of us receive some unexpected money during the year. It might be an unexpected refund of some kind, or some winning at Bingo or the lottery, or an inheritance. It could be income from a tag sale or a birthday gift. Any of us could decide to offer some portion of that new money to the church.

It is also common for people who give weekly to miss weeks when they are away. We can simply decide to write those checks before we go on vacation so we don't fall behind. Using automatic withdrawal also prevents this.

Here's another idea. Let's say you decide to buy a new item - tv, phone, couch, mower, etc. When you go to get it, you discover to your glee that it is on sale. You could donate some portion of what you saved to the church.

All these ways may seem small steps, but they add up, especially if many households are trying them. Together we can build a strong financial foundation for our present and future ministry.

Wow! It's hard to believe we are entering the last quarter of 2025! Where has the time gone? It's been a busy year and is trending to end the same way with the start of the roof and solar project. The financial information has been submitted to secure the loan. Once approved we can move on to the next step which property will handle.

For this newsletter, I would like to focus on the 2026 budget process. All committees must submit their budget to Margaret at <a href="mailto:bookkeeper@stpaulstorrington.com">bookkeeper@stpaulstorrington.com</a> <a href="mailto:bookkeeper@stpaulstorrington.com">NO LATER</a> than October 17, 2025. Once received, Margaret and I will compile the information into the budget format to present at the finance meeting on November 5<sup>th</sup>. The finance committee will review the budget and make recommendations if applicable. Finance will then submit the budget to the church council at the meeting to be held on November 10<sup>th</sup>. Council will also review each line item and make recommendations is applicable. The final budget will be presented to the congregation in December at the Annual meeting scheduled for December 11<sup>th</sup>. Key date are below:

October 17, 2026 - Committees must submit their 2026 budget to the bookkeeper's via email at bookkeeper@stpaulstorrington.com

November 5, 2026 – Finance reviews the budget to submit to council.

November 10, 2026 - Council review the budget to submit to the congregation.

November 30, 2026 – Budget packet is available to the congregation.

December 11, 2026 - Congregational Meeting Part I

Please note, if a budget is <u>NOT</u> received by October 17<sup>th</sup>, we will use the run rate for your committee's line items off of the 2025 P&L. You can request a copy of your committee's spending, by line item, by contacting office, emailing the bookkeeper, or contacting me. You can also see a copy of the YTD P&L hanging on the bulletin board outside the office to see what you have spent this year YTD.

♥ Hand lotions Hair accessories/bows Christmas Cards






