A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Friends and Members of St. Paul's,

As most of you know, I usually use this page to reflect on some aspect of faith, the Church Year or Season, or some Biblical theme. This month is different.

What I am most aware of at this odd time is simply my deep and profound appreciation of you. Some of you are leaders and laborers in the life of the congregation. Some are regular worshipers. Some are regular donors. Some are unable to be with us often when we gather, but continue to hold St. Paul's in prayer and affection. Some of you are connected loosely on the margins of our ministry, while others are invested in many committees, events, and projects. You cook, clean, repair, garden, sing, teach, study, and do all the quiet but needed chores that make our congregation tick. Some drop in from time to time out of need or curiosity.





Your Appointment With God

"Come close to God, and God will come close to you. Wash your hands, you sinners; purify your hearts, for your loyalty is divided between God and the world." NLT James 4:8

During this period of isolation and social distancing I have to think that perhaps this is a season where we are being called to be still and to grow in our relationship with God. 

PRAYER SHAWLS

or for the knitters:

Materials: one skein cotton fleece yarn by Brown Sheep co. or any Double Knitting weight- DK. Worsted is heavier so you should be sure to get the DK weight.

In Sheep's Clothing Yarn Store in Torrington has appropriate yarn as I'm sure JoAnn's too.

Be sure it's soft but has a little body to it too. You also need a size 6 circular needle 16" length and a set of size 6 double pointed needles.

Directions:

Cast on 96 stitches and knit in the round being careful not to twist the first row.

Knit every round for about 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ " above the natural curl of the bottom of the hat.

DECREASE as follows:

Round 1 k6, k2 together, repeat to end of round

Round 2 and all even rows, knit all sets.

Round 3 K5, k2 together, repeat to end of round

Round 5 K4, k2 together, repeat to end of round

Round 7 K3, k2 together, repeat to end of round

Round 9 K2, k2 together, repeat to end of round

Round 11 K1, k2 together repeat to end of round

Round 13 k2 together all around

New Born Hats for CHH: Directions:

--- CH 2 always counts as 1 DC. (or CH 3, which ever you usually like to use)

CH 4 or 5 (which ever you usually like to use to make a ring). SL ST in first ST to form a ring.

Round 1 - CH 2, 11 DC in ring. SL ST in top of CH 2. (12 DC)

Round 2 - CH 2, DC in the same ST. 2 DC in each ST around. SL ST in top of CH 2. (24 DC)

Round 3 - CH 2, *2 DC in next ST, DC in next ST*; Repeat around. SL ST in top of CH 2. (36 DC)

Round 4 - CH 2, DC in next ST. *2 DC in next ST, DC in next 2 ST*; Repeat around. SL ST in top of CH 2. (48 DC)

Round 5 - CH 2, DC in next 2 ST. *2 DC in next ST, DC in next 3 ST*; Repeat around. SL ST in top of CH 2. (60 DC)

• If making child sized cap use fewer "2 DC in next ST" in this round or skip this round.

Repeat rounds 7 & 8 until cap is the length that you want, ending with either round. Finish off. Alternate ending round - CH 1 & either SC OR HDC around. SL ST in top of CH 1. Finish off.


