A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Friends and Members of St. Paul's,

As we continue in shut-down mode, I need your assistance to provide the best care for our own membership and the wider community we serve. To that end, I am asking for some or your best thoughts and ideas to support our families, friends, and neighbors.

There are a few specific groups I'm concerned about:

- The very isolated...those who live alone, especially those who have no near relatives of friends to check in on them, and those who have little or no access to computers, tablets, cell phones, or other electronic media
- Those who have challenging medical conditions
- Those who lost loved ones in the past year, or whose grief is still deep
- Those who may live with others, but in relationships that are a source of stress or hurt
- Young people who are cut off from friends, social activities, and events
- Anyone who had a special day planned...a wedding, baptism, ordination, confirmation, prom, etc.
- Anyone who was looking forward to a special vacation or trip, in-person class or job, or other event that has been either cancelled or postponed.

I'm also intersected in your best ideas about worship. As you read this, I will have done two different formats: Facebook Live at 10 am most Sundays, and recorded and uploaded to the church website for May 31, Pentecost. I need to know your feelings and reactions to these two styles. Our services from last year are also always posted. As we consider whether to offer something like a drive in service, how would you feel about that, and would you attend? We would expect strict distancing, so there would be no exiting of cars to get close to the cars of others.

I am also concerned for our wider community. I need your help to understand which social services and non profits are in most need of help, which underserved populations are most in need, and creative ways we can reach out. Is our Sharing Garden viable in this time? If so, are the normal ways of getting the food to people functioning? Do our neighbors and agencies need more food drives, cash help, or extended publicity that we could provide? Should we ramp up and continue our mask making? If so, are distribution modes working? If not, are there other ways to meet basic needs?

I see all this as a combination of pastoral/spiritual care, social ministry, and safe church commitments. We are caring for each other and for those who need our help. All ideas are welcome and encouraged. One note, if you want to let me know of a specific person in need, please do not use their full name in any public or non-secure format. For example, do not use email or an open Facebook post to tell me "Eddie Haskell is struggling with depression. You should call him." Rather, let me know that you are concerned about someone. I'll call you to get details. Or call the office to let Rachel know. She'll contact me in a secure way. Of course, if you yourself are in need, do not hesitate to call me.

We are grateful for the inflow of offerings during this time. If you need help getting your offerings to the church, please call the office. If you would like information on setting up an automatic withdrawal as an easy way to make your offering, also call the office.

Thank you all also for your faithful service and compassion. Together, we can serve each other and our neighbors in the name and Spirit of Christ.

HILLTOP NEWS

What strange times we are in! Due to Covid-19, Hilltop has been closed since March 13th. None of our spring plans happened, and we will continue to be closed through the end of the school year and will not have any summer programming. With the uncertainty around how this virus is affecting things, we don't really know what to expect by September. The Hilltop Advisory Committee is staying in close contact with me and I with them in regards to protocols and recommendations for early childhood



programs. I am doing all I can to stay informed from the Office of Early Childhood and other supports in regards to what reopening would look like.

Since we have been out of school, our Hilltop staff has been doing amazing things to keep our families engaged. We have a private Facebook group where they have been doing daily posts with activities around math, literacy, fine motor, gross motor, art, music, social-emotional as well as sharing recipes to do at home. Someone reads a book every day in the group, and I am continuing the Music Together Online through this group. Teachers are also leading weekly Zoom Circle Time Meetings for each class. What fun to hear their voices and see their faces!

We will be closing out our year a little early, as family/child participation in these activities has been dropping. The teachers will come in for their final clean out on May 26. Most of their deep cleaning was completed in March, but they still need to take down photos, artwork and do a final button down of their rooms. They will need to bag up the children's things to return to them. On May 29, we will have a parade in the commuter parking lot at St. Paul's. The teachers will be safely distanced from one another in the parking lot, and families will come through the lot in parade fashion for a final "see you later" parade. I expect there will be some smiles and tears!

As I mentioned earlier, we are doing our best to stay informed about what we need to do if we are prepared to reopen in September. As it stands, our license through the state of Connecticut's Office of Early Childhood makes us "essential". However, since we are primarily part time preschool, most families do not rely on us for child care. Our policy has always been that we follow the lead of the Torrington Public Schools in relation to opening and closing, so we have stayed true to that and have been closed. We are in a position to reopen when we wish, but there are strong restrictions that need to be considered if and when we are ready to reopen. I suspect most, if not all of those restrictions will still be in place in September, so we will have a lot to contemplate as we make a decision to move ahead. Please keep the Hilltop Advisory Committee and the staff in your thoughts and prayers, that we would make wise judgements moving forward.

I want to recognize the Hilltop staff as we close out the year. They have stayed true to Hilltop and been the voice calm in the midst of chaos, and I appreciate the team we are and the way we have navigated this challenging situation. Hilltop is blessed to have such loving and high quality teachers! Nicole Sears, Monica Valente, Lezlie Fosbrook and Michelle Miller lead each class with affection and patience. Christina Brzoska, Megan Roberts, Nicole Waldron and Teresa Guzman have come alongside the lead teachers and helped build strong teams in each room, which easily translated into a top notch Hilltop team! What a blessing it is to be a part of Hilltop and St. Paul's. I am proud of the role Hilltop plays in the community, and I hope that you are too!





Hilltop Advisory Committee is a real blessing to Hilltop! Pam Little and Ron Travis along with the rest of the committee, dedicate their time, not only for the monthly meetings, but also for other projects they take on! There are many challenges in the supervising of Hilltop, but they are always thinking only of the best for everyone! Thank God for their leadership during this challenging time. Truly, the saying "we are in this together" couldn't ring more true! The Property Board Is always quick to respond when Hilltop has a property need. The Property board rep for Hilltop, Jim Clavette has answered the call when needed in a timely fashion!

We are truly grateful for our custodian, who puts his heart in keeping this space looking good! He keeps the education wing clean for not just Hilltop, but also the church and other organizations who meet here. Though his work was cut short due to Covid, he is planning to come in over the summer to polish up the floors! He completed his deep cleaning in March, but will come back at the end of the summer to be sure all things are ready and waiting for a new school year!

We would also like to thank Rachel and Jean for all the work they do for us! Whatever question or concern I have, they have an answer! Jean is a saint as she wrestles with the challenges that Hilltop offers her! Thank you to Pastor Cady for supporting Hilltop.

Finally, we thank Mary Magnoli for her continuing efforts with the Boxtops for Education program. The boxtops campaign adds money to our play yard/ Enrichment Fund when it's needed. I also wish to thank each of YOU for your support for Hilltop through prayer, public relations, and saving those Boxtops for Education!

The School Readiness funds continued to come in to us even though we were closed the last few months, of which we are grateful for. These funds will continue next year.

We are sending out our regular communications to our incoming families as usual, with hopes we will reopen. We continue to take in registrations for the fall. Registration is ongoing through the summer. If classes fill, we keep waiting lists. We have spaces in most classes, though class sizes may have to change due to the virus. Don't forget...we have some slots for families from lower incomes in the School Readiness class. Please be sure to share Hilltop with friends and family.



The church building maybe closed, but the work of the church is thriving! From Paula "Dear St. Paul's Members and Friends, It is with sincere thanks that I am thrilled to announce that in our last few days worth of sewing, we have collected 522 masks. I have them bundled according to size and they will be shipped to our Navajo Friends in Rock Point, AZ as well as to Lutheran World Relief's 75,000+ Mask Challenge. Our church building may be closed but we continue to do God's Work with Our Hands. Thanks to all who contributed in any way. The need for masks continues locally and beyond. We will continue to receive masks here at St. Paul's, 837 Charles St. Torrington. We promise to place these gifts of love into the hands of those who need them most. Vacation Bible School

It is with a heavy heart that we have decided to cancel VBS this summer. Do to the uncertain times, we are erring on the side of caution. We will have Sidney the Sloth join us in the summer of 2021!



Payroll Protection Program Loan

As a result of the COVID 19 / Coronavirus, the US Congress has approved, and the President of the United States has signed a 2.2 trillion relief package called, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES ACT). One of the components to the relief package is what is called the Payroll Protection Program (PPP), supported by a 350 billion dollar allocation. It essentially allows for non-profits and small businesses to apply for relief of eligible expenses such as: payroll, utilities, rent, and mortgage. The Payroll Protection Program allows for non-profits and small business to apply for relief of eligible expenses to apply for eligible expenses over the 8 week period start February 15 until June 30th.

In order to apply, non-profits, like St. Paul's Church would need to calculate its average monthly expenses based on numbers for 2019 (of which St. Paul's eligible expenses would be payroll and utilities only, because the church does not pay rent or have a mortgage), and multiple by a factor of 2.5 (application instructions) to arrive at the amount applying for.

St. Paul's has applied for the Payroll Protection Program in the amount of \$66,254.85, and has been approved through Torrington Savings Bank. Funds have been transferred into the church checking account. At the inception of the Payroll Protection Program, funds are treated as a loan, and providing PPP funds are allocated for eligible expenses, and documentation is provided to substantiate the said, then the loan and any accrued interest is forgiven. The loan essentially transitions from the status of a loan to one of a forgivable grant.

Good Sunny Day to you!!

We know that you have been growing starter plans for us and for that we are blessed by your assistance. Feel free to contact one of us or Rachel when you drop them by. We will be planting non- frost resistant crops at the end of May. All the food pantries need our supplies now more than ever as unfortunately unemployment is at about 14.7% as of this writing. There are many households we are aware of that have filed for benefits and have not received them yet. There is quite the backlog.

We also need "man" power. We truly need devoted assistance; weeding, planting and most importantly harvesting and delivery. Thankfully many are still working on our committee, but that leaves us in a predicament. We ask for 1 day a week of weeding and harvesting. If you cannot deliver on that day, we understand, and that is where the delivery folks come in. If you don't know when to pick something, we can assist with that (it should be a little smaller than what you are receiving from the store). If you are unsure if it is a weed, we can assist you with that also. Most of our beds will have something in them to keep the weeds down, but weeding is still needed.

Also, if you would like to "adopt a bed" meaning providing plants for that bed or even better planting it yourself. Each week each person will be weeding and harvesting the whole garden so there is limited stress and who doesn't love sunshine and fresh air. Bring you kids down with you as it would count toward community service!!!

Please spread the word. We need to feed our sheep!!


