Dear Friends and Members of St. Paul's



THE GARDENS



The Monarch Sanctuary Waystation

The Monarch Sanctuary shifted from preparation and planning, to sowing and planting in June. In the lower section of the Sanctuary, we planted pumpkin, gourd, and sunflower seeds. The pumpkin and gourd plants will attract pollinators and if they do well, it will provide some big Jack O Lanterns in the fall and perhaps some gourd bird houses. The sunflowers are pollinators and will also attract birds. The seeds have germinated, and we are presently thinning the seedlings. The sunflowers were planted in height descending order, with the waist high sunflowers closest to the bird bath.

Those visiting the Sanctuary will see the new focal point of the Waystation and that is the rustic birdbath, generously donated by June Seiser (pictured below). The concrete base is shaped like a tree stump and the basin features a squirrel, perched on the edge of the basin. The birdbath has been discovered by deer, who also stopped to munch on recently planted phlox! We hope if the deer continue to visit, they will save their appetite for the meadow, versus the perennial plants.

To attract Monarchs, we require milk weed and the garden has two types. They are growing in the front corners. The "Common Milk Weed" (Asclepias Syriaca) is the type we typically see in fields and it has a pink blossom. This has been plentiful in the garden and is growing well, with plants now nearly 3 feet tall and flowering. The 2nd type of milk weed is the "Butterfly Weed" (Asclepias Tuberosa) and we have 3 plants that are just starting to grow. At maturity, it will have orange blossoms.

Deb Pike, Master Gardener from Canton was generous to donate over a dozen different types of perennial plants to the Monarch Sanctuary. Supplemental perennials were purchased. Presently, we have the following plants and roots in the ground or will be planted in June: Phlox, Coneflower, Aster, Day Lily, Black-eyed Susan, Liatris, Butterfly Bush, Yarrow, Anise Hyssop, Bee Balm, Balloon Flower, Shasta Daisy, Salvia, Penstemon, Lupine, and Coreopsis.

A few annuals will be planted to add color and allow for different looks at different times of the season. These will include Hollyhock, Petunias, Latana and Zinnia's. All plants will be labeled for easy identification, and mulch paths will be added, once planting is finished.

Two bird houses were generously donated by June Seiser and we will be evaluating the best placement in the Sanctuary over the summer.

The focus for July and August is watering and weeding to establish good root systems for the new perennials and monitoring pest damage and any diseases.

The Sharing Garden

The growing and harvesting season has begun! In early June, the gardeners brought our first harvest of leafy greens and fresh onions to FISH (pictured below). Master Gardener Deb Pike from Canton was generous to donate 24 tomato and 36 summer & winter squash plants, which were planted and are maturing. The first tomatoes have started to grow on the vines. Our potato plants are flowering, and the snap peas have produced their first pods and will be ready for harvest before the end of June.

The timer on the hose irrigation was replaced and special thanks to June Seiser for ordering and installing the new timer.

We were also fortunate to receive a Bee Mason & Bug Boarding House, donated from June Seiser (pictured below). June handcrafted and mounted the Bug Motel on the side of the gardening shed and we already have 6 bees and insects that are boarding. We are happy to report that all blue bird houses are occupied. If you are in the lower parking lot or near the Monarch Sanctuary in the early evening, you can see the proud blue bird parents feeding their young. July and August will be peak harvesting months for the gardens.

St. Paul's Lutheran Church Fall Fair Vendor Rules & Regulations

- The Fall Fair is currently in its 15th year however this is the first time we are holding the fair since the Covid 19 pandemic. We will be following CDC guidelines for social distancing and masks at the time of the fair. We may have to spread displays out; we are committed to using as much space on the main level as needed for safety.
- All items must be homemade or upcycled. No kits or items mass produced will be allowed. Creativity, originality, and quality are important criteria for acceptance.
- Vendors must submit a photograph(s) of their display and describe in detail the items you wish to sell.
- The deadline for submission of the completed application, fee, and supporting photo is October 1, 2021.
- Vendors will be notified of their acceptance as soon after the application deadline as possible. If you are not accepted your check will be returned.
- All spaces are 8' in length. We will supply one 8' table and two folding chairs per display area, if needed. (Please indicate the need for a table on your application.)
- Please note that there are a limited number of vendor spaces with electricity. Please indicate your need on your application form. We will do our best to accommodate you on a first come, first served basis according to the postmark on the application.
- All vendors must be set-up for the entire length of the fair.
- You may set-up your display on Friday, November 5th between 2pm 4pm or beginning Saturday morning at 7:30am. (Please note that the building will be locked and secured overnight although individual spaces will not be.)
- Nothing may be leaned on or attached to the walls at your display.
- While this is the 15th year of the Fall Fair, it is our second year with vendors. We will depend on you to help spread the news of our event and your participation on social media. We will also e-mail a poster to you for sharing. St. Paul's publicizes the Fair through social media, newspapers, and radio. Our event has been held on the first Saturday in November for many years.
- No "edibles" of any kind can be sold and no drawing/raffles are allowed at your table.
- All vendors must contain their display, their work, and their storage boxes within the dimensions of the space they rent.
- Once you have been accepted as a vendor, no refunds on display space(s) will be made.
- Displays must be broken down and removed from the church by 4:30pm on Saturday, November 6th.
- After unloading your items, vendors must move their vehicle to the lower parking lot on the day of the Fair.
- We are inviting vendors to donate an item from their display for a vendor basket to add to our theme basket drawing. If you wish to donate an item, please indicate that on your application. Thank you for your consideration.
- We are hopeful that we can have our usual homemade soup and sandwich luncheon for purchase if you wish. A complimentary cup of coffee and doughnut will be given to each vendor. We also hope to also have a homemade bakery sale that will include our popular Scandinavian Almond Cakes. The lunch and bake sale are dependent upon health department Covid 19 guidelines in the fall.
- Vendors must release St. Paul's Lutheran Church and the Fall Fair Committee of all liability for personal injury and for loss of property due to theft, fire, accident, damage, or weather.




