A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

The fall is off to a great start with several teams, committees, and activities up and running or well into the planning stages.

There are a few gaps that I really want to address. I hope some of you will be willing to join me to strengthen our ministry.

The first is Evangelism. I'm not going to ask you to knock on doors, but I want to meet with a team to plan and staff a table or tent at the Farmers' Market this coming summer. To do this right, we need a rotation of teams, maybe 4 sets of 2, or four families, who will sit at a table each Saturday from about 10-12 or so. Each team or family would only do this once every 4 weeks for the summer. We'll have material to hand out, some freebies, and some coffee to sell. This is a simple, but I think possible very effective way to invite our neighbors to our church.

Likewise, we need to begin planning our summer concert series this winter. We want to get a full calendar set up with at least 4, maybe 6, concerts. This team will plan the events, and help set up and clean up for each. Again, if we had two teams or two families who would host one concert, and another two to do the next one, each team or family would only have duty 2 or 3 times in the summer. We could plan better advertising as well as more material to share with concert attendees about St. Paul's.

I need a group of adults to come together to brainstorm ways to re-start our Youth Group. This can certainly include those who have done this before, but some new folks might also bring some fresh ideas and energy. I'd like to begin this before this calendar year is out, so we can offer some activities and events to our younger members. Maybe we could join with another congregation to increase the numbers.

Finally - and this is a completely new idea - I'm looking for a single person or family to expand our connection to the wider church. Specifically, I am looking for someone who will watch the websites of the New England Synod, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and the Lutheran World Federation. As news, events, programs, or issues arise on those sites that you find interesting, challenging, or uplifting, you would summarize them for a monthly newsletter article.

I hope some of these initiatives finds willing souls to jump on board. Please contact me directly if you would like to volunteer, or even just to discuss the idea.

Meet Me In The Garden

If you want your garden to grow, you need to water it on a regular basis.

Jesus speaks about the vine and the branches. "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardner. "
...Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine."



A branch that is detached from the vine quickly withers and dies. If it remains on the vine it continues to be fed, nourished, thrive, and bears fruit. John 15:1-8

We don't have to go to church to be saved, but staying away from church is dangerous. Staying away from church is like going to the beach, leaving your blanket in the sand, and going out into the water. As you swim and play you drift further than you think and suddenly you no longer can see where you left your blanket. That's what happens when we stop going to church. We drift unknowingly away.

Hebrews 10:25 (NIV) says, "we should not be giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another...."

Sunday morning offers us many choices. It offers the "sleep in" option, it offers a "brunch" option, it offers the "read the Sunday paper" option, and it offers us all kinds of choices having to do with recreation. How tragic to see people zealously provide for their bodies but not their souls. We need to ask ourselves, what is forming and shaping me? According to Scripture your soul needs nourishment. We are reminded that "man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. (Deuteronomy 8:3; Matthew 4:4)

We need the encouragement that church attendance affords. There is nothing more powerful than to worship God and take communion with the community of other believers. To gather together in prayer, praising our Father with beautiful music and hymns and listening to God's word strengthens and renews us if we worship in spirit (from the heart). It's like the burning coals in the fireplace. If you remove a burning coal from the fire, it will grow cold. When you place it back in the fireplace, it once again will burn brightly.

For a church body to function properly, all of its "body parts" (members) need to be present and working (1 Corinthians 12:14-20). Our spiritual gifts and talents should be used for the common good. A believer will never reach full spiritual maturity without having that outlet for his/her gifts, and we all need the assurance and encouragement of other believers.

Make regular church attendance a priority and let it be a good habit that becomes a part of who you are. There will always be a competition for your time and other things you could do on a Sunday.

When you go to church, <u>you are setting a good example</u>, especially for your children. What is forming and shaping them? Whose image are they growing into? If you do not introduce them to Christ, the world will introduce them to its values.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over Labor Day weekend the A/C unit outside the Fellowship Hall iced up and the resulting water leak caused damage to the floor tiles in the hallway. Testing of the materials in the area revealed that the tile, the first layer of plywood, cove baseboard, and wallboard up to the 2ft level must be removed. Due to presence of asbestos, the hallway and classrooms on the upper level will have to be remediated in accordance with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations governing the safe removal and disposal of asbestos materials.

We have notified our insurance company, Utica, and as a result, SEVPRO will begin remediation and removal of all that area noted above on **11/07/22**. It is anticipated that the remediation will take 10 days to complete.

The upper level and lower level of the Fellowship Hall, from the fire doors to the ramp, will be closed off until we have received a clean air test result that ensure that all the asbestos has been properly remediated.

During this timeframe, the rest of the church WILL BE OPEN. Services will not be cancelled. The office will operate on regular schedule. Sunday School, Confirmation Classes, Bible study and Committees meetings will also be held. Arrangements have been made to move the classes/meetings to other areas of the church that are unaffected by the work. Outside organizations that use our building will also be able to meet in the church during this timeframe.

The preschool will be relocated to KidsPlay, located on Main Street Torrington for approximately 10 days. A parents meeting will be held on October 26, 2022, at 7:00 pm to explain the details to them.

From time to time during the installation of the new flooring there will be temporary closure of the affected area.




