

Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

Summer here at St. Paul's is a very active time. Sunday School and Confirmation classes are on hold, but other activities are in full swing.

We are very excited about our Concert Series. Each 3rd Saturday from 5:30pm to 7, we have musical groups scheduled to come and share their music with us. Weather permitting, we do this outside. It is a great time to come over, bring a picnic supper, relax on the lawn and enjoy the talent.

VBS is always a hit with the little ones who attend, and is a great way for older kids and young adults to be involved in a fun and educational week. This year it is August 7-11. Pamela and the Christian Ed Committee put a lot of effort into this program with excellent results. There's a rumor that I will be the "mascot" this year! Again, if you'd like to help with this ministry, there is plenty to do. But even if that's not "your thing," please make sure any young people in your circle of friends and family are aware and welcome to come. Our VBS is never a strictly in-house activity. Each year some students and leaders come from the wider community.

The Tag Sale will have happened by the time you read this, but it, too, is part of our vibrant summer programing.

It is not too late to offer some time to our Sharing Garden. There is room to plant and harvest some of the faster growing produce, or to purchase plants like peppers and tomatoes that are well along from local nurseries. Hannah Winzler is our coordinator for this project. Any food we harvest is given to our local feeding agencies.

Of course our worship continues at the regular time each Sunday. On the best weather weekends, anyone who'd like to help set up a social time after worship outside can work with the coffee hour hosts to do that. We will also begin to offer monthly "Potluck and Praise" evening events for spiritual edification and easy fellowship. It is possible that a few of these could be outside on nice evenings, too.

And one request....As some of you travel about this summer, try to visit other churches. Bring back any literature they give out, and make notes about the most attractive or welcoming things they do that we might incorporate here.

Synod Assembly News



At the recent Synod Assembly we learned of some new opportunities.


One is that we will elect a new bishop next year. A new process has been set up to allow any member of the synod to nominate any ELCA pastor to be elected for a 6 year term as bishop. Before, only voting members of the Assembly could nominate a candidate. Now any of you can nominate any Word and Sacrament Minister from anywhere in the ELCA to be our next bishop.

Second, there is to be a very extensive and exciting Youth Gathering in New Orleans next summer. For the first time, there will be an event specifically for "Young Adults." Our definition of that term is anyone between 18 and 30 years of age. St. Paul's has several people in that category, so I'd love to see if we can send them off.

Also, if any of you adults are interested in being a volunteer at the part of the event that is offered for our high schoolers, you can do so. This would allow you to get a taste of the enthusiasm of 20,000 to 30,000 Lutheran teens from around the US all gathered for worship, service, fellowship and fun.

Third, there are 2 programs designed for young people who want to take a year off between high school and college to do volunteer work either in the US or in somewhere else in the world. This second is called Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM). I know of 2 people who did this from my last parish. One went to South Africa and the other to Romania. Both eventually went to seminary. One is a pastor, the other a seminary professor. I know less about the domestic program, but would love to explore that if we have any young people who might be interested. These programs usually offer a stipend and are very well managed.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Sunday June 18, 2023, I spoke to the congregation about allowing Friendly Hands Food Bank, (FHFB) the use of our parking lot for their farmers market and pet food distributions that take place on Wednesdays.

At the June meeting, Council agreed to allow FHFB to use our parking lot on a temporary basis. The Council will review the situation at its August meeting and decide whether or not to continue the arrangement with FHFB.

A number of challenges were observed this past Wednesday, of which, some are listed below:

A number of challenges were observed this past Wednesday. This list may not be all inclusive, but these are at the forefront as we work with FHFB to create a smoother operation on Wednesday afternoons, and they are:

- Better crowd control, Keeping people out of the traffic lanes through the upper parking lot
- Use of Bathrooms in the church by FHFB clients.
- Arrival times of FHFB clients prior to start of distribution of food.
- How to handle afternoon pickup once preschool returns in the fall.
- · Preschool Staff Parking.

The executive board of the Council and the preschool director will meet on Wednesday June 28, 2023, to begin to address the issues above.

The diagram provided shows the parking spots that will be available for church members and visitors on Wednesday afternoon. Please know that you can park in the handicap spaces even if you do not have a handicapped sticker. If you are asked why you are parking in the upper lot, please tell the FHFB representative that you're here for a church activity and proceed inside.




