Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

A Blessed Christmas and a festive New Year to you all! We enter the season marked with both memories and mystery – a time of joy, devotion, merriment, and reflection. May all of you reading this experience these weeks in ways that lift up our hopes and delights, as well as open us to fresh ways to understand God's presence in our lives.

Christmas and the weeks surrounding it are filled with at least two overall experiences for Christians. One is the whole interlaced set of events that revolve around family, food, music, decorations, and gifts. Shared by people of faith and our secular neighbors, our American version of Christmas is a glittering time of festivities and celebrations. It is intended to interrupt our normal routines with cheer and wonderment. Even in the face of an almost oppressive commercialism, most of us find some parts of this time to be lovely and heartwarming.

For faithful Christians, there is a second (not secondary!) theme, of course. This is the powerful and very mysterious theological meaning of the season. It is the time to reflect on the Incarnation. We Christians make a profound, and profoundly unusual, claim about the events on which our traditions are based. We claim that the God who created the world, the eternal deity, the invisible, spiritual, and eternal divine One, entered our world in the flesh of an infant in Bethlehem some two Millenia ago. We believe that the fullness of the one who made and rules the universe humbly took on our human nature in order to bring forgiveness and salvation to all. We teach that in the person of Jesus, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, the Son of God, became fully human in order to restore and transform our broken world and our broken lives.

Taken together, these twin aspects of the holiday season can truly enrich our lives. We tend to be very busy people. So much so that we can miss opportunities to share good times with those who are close to us. The traditions of Christmas provide us an important time to spend with those we love. Not only one or two days, but often life-long memories are formed and valued family traditions are passed on. And to add even more meaning to these very rich human moments we have the promises of grace, mercy, love and hope from the Babe in the manger. As close as we come to each other around a tree or table, God comes even closer, entering our lives in the sweetest and simplest way – in the face of the Child of Bethlehem.

May these two blessings be full for each of you, and may they usher in a New Year of faithfulness, peace, and joy.

In just a few weeks, we will be approving our 2024 budget. Your church committees, council, and finance team, along with our bookkeeper, Jean Schlapfer, have worked very hard to present to you a realistic budget. Finance and Council will also be presenting a second budget that we are referring to as "bare bones". The congregation will decide which one we use, and any adjustments that need to be made to either one or both.

I pray that everyone eligible to vote will be present on Sunday, December 10th. Your input and participation in finalizing our budget is crucial to the welfare of our congregation. You will see that instead of using funds from our investments to balance the budget, we plan to kick off a capital campaign in January, with your approval. This campaign will be to raise money to cover our shortfall and hopefully raise enough funds to start some much-needed repairs to our building.

We have struggled here at St. Paul's when it comes to increasing our weekly giving (Sunday envelopes). However, there is no more giving congregation when it comes to helping others within our walls or beyond. We are asking that each of us look closely at what our commitment to our congregation is. We must either see a sharp increase in weekly offerings or raise the money via a campaign if we hope to keep our doors open and maintain our various ministries. I pray that as a congregation, we all lift our congregation to the Lord, and pray mightily, for what we can do to improve our financial stability.

Electronic Giving is Simple Giving

Electronic giving gives you a reliable, safe way to move your stewardship plan into action. Your donation is given consistently and your church benefits from a steady and more predictably revenue. It's convenient and saves you time. Electronic giving also saves the church money because those using it no longer need weekly envelopes. Currently we spend approximately \$800 dollars a year sending these envelopes to church members.

You determine when your payment is made, the frequency, how it is to be distributed (i.e. – Operation, World Hunger, Repair & Restoration, Pastor's Discretionary, etc.) and whether it comes out of your bank account (Checking or Savings) or charged to a credit card.

To set up electronic giving all you need to do is call the office and request a Simple Giving authorization form. Fill it out and return it to the office. It's that simple.


