A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Friends and Members of St. Paul's,

Martin Luther had a very clear sense of the relationship between the church and government. Some people of his time, such as some Anabaptists, for example, felt there should be no overlap between Christians living under the kingship of Christ, and the "kingdoms of the world." They feared that secular values would pollute the purity of the Body of Christ. Others, such as the Roman Catholics and the Calvinists, believed that worldly authority and church authority should be tightly united, even insisting that political leaders should also be church leaders. They believed that such an arrangement would keep the political realm from becoming corrupt.

Luther took issue with both these ideas. He put forward a doctrine of "two kingdoms." God's "right hand" is represented by the church, the kingdom of Christ. But God's "left hand" is seen in the secular state. The church is a gift from God to bring grace and the Gospel to people. The state is God's gift of peace, justice, and order, within which the church can effectively do its work. The church can, and often must, challenge the state, when the state refuses to maintain peace and justice, or when it abuses its powers. But the two "kingdoms," while both are gifts from God, have two different callings. They compliment each other, but neither controls the other.

In our time, many have come to think of government as a problem, even an evil. The ELCA continues to view government, while never perfect, as a gift from God bringing order and stability to society. And we see the church, while also not perfect, as a gift from God to bear witness to the Gospel. Both are good, and both are necessary.

This is a pivotal year for American Democracy. It is important for thoughtful citizens to find ways to elect people who will serve those who elect them. This must include the willingness and ability to recognize the plurality of our nation, and to do the serious work of meaningful governance with colleagues who have different ideas about policies. For our government to fulfill its role as a gift from God for justice, peace, and stability, those who hold any form of public office must be open to achievable, practical, and sustainable solutions to the issues we all face.

Let us do our parts by understanding the proposals the candidates put forward, and their track record of working to unite us around a future based on our nation's most noble values. Then let us vote not only for our own narrow interests, but in ways that lift the downtrodden, give voice to the voiceless, constrain violence and greed, and celebrate the glorious diversity that is one of America's best blessings.

As we in the church proclaim the Gospel of God's amazing grace in worship and work, let us also strive to raise up public servants in the secular sphere who will help forge a society awash with compassion, respect, and civility to be a beacon of hope for all the world.


St. Paul's Lutheran Church is offering families the use of its garden plots in its sharing garden located at 837 Charles St.



2-year-olds Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:30-11:30


3 & 4-year-olds 3 days a week. Mondays, Wednesdays, & Fridays 9:30-12:00.

Good Morning, My name is Ethan Schaller and I am a senior confirmation student here at St. Paul's. Each confirmation class does a class project and this year, since I am a class of one, I am reaching out to each of you to help me. I would like to make some Blessing Bags for homeless members of our community. We've learned that homelessness happens for many reasons, oftentimes due to mental illness, substance addiction, or just plain bad luck. I'd like to make some of these bags that are filled with things like personal care products (toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, chapstick, sunscreen, comb & brush), snacks (individually wrapped snacks like chips, granola bars, cookies & crackers, wrapped candy, but not chocolate since it will melt in the summer), bottled water, hand towel & washcloth, a bar of soap but nothing with a strong scent, flashlight with extra batteries, white tube socks, new or gently used tee shirts, and a \$5-\$10 gift card from McDonald's, Burger King, Dunkin, or Cumby's. 
