A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

Summer has arrived! I pray that your plans will include many activities that are uplifting, relaxing, and positive. Please plan as best you are able to use your time to get some relief from whatever stressors there may be in your life. Connecting to nature, God, family and friends are often helpful.

In the area of faith, I'll suggest a couple things. If you are one who likes to do summer reading, you can add in a book related to faith. There are great fiction and non-fiction books that help us reflect and deepen our sense of God's purposes. I'd be happy to offer ideas if you'd like to consider this. If you are travelling, you might consider attending a different church while away. You will not only see a different style of worship, but you may be able to bring back good ideas for us to incorporate in our practice.

Some of us find room for a slight shift in our daily routines during summer. If so, you could consider adding in a quiet prayer time in the quiet moments around sunrise, or that extended twilight time before bed. If possible, this could be done on a deck or porch, in the yard, or at a beach, or anywhere that brings a sense of peace. If you have any inclination to garden, either vegetables or flowers, this is the natural time to do it. As your hands are getting dirty, you can deliberately think about the ways that your connection to God's good creation is a sweet blessing. If your garden is abundant, you can be generous to the Community Kitchen or Friendly Hands Food Bank.

Sadly, summer also often brings some hard weather to our nation and the world. Whether it is droughts, floods, tornados, hurricanes, or wildfires, we will inevitably hear of people in need of help. There are many practical, local ways to help, and many effective organizations that can funnel help further away. Our own ELCA Disaster Response and Lutheran World Relief are two such agencies. Some people even use vacation time to go volunteer with clean up projects after a disaster.

God's call to us is year-round and allows for many varied responses to our own needs and our neighbors' needs as well. Summer may offer some specific ways to respond. May your faith and gratitude draw you to use your opportunities for your own well-being, and that of your neighbors too.

Finance



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The finance committee is happy to report that we have not had to touch investments in order to meet our monthly bills through the first four (4) months of this year. May is trending in the same direction. So far this year, income is up slightly, and expenses are right on budget.

At the budget meeting the congregation voted to have a capital campaign to raise approximately \$100,000 to offset the budget deficit and \$100,000 for much needed repairs. Through April, we have only raised \$6,562.14. This is well below the amount we budgeted. Fortunately, we have received over \$15,000 from fundraisers, fellowship dinner proceeds, and private donations, not associated with the capital campaign. Hilltop income and Sunday offerings are also over budget.

As positive as all that is, we still need everyone in the congregation to do their part in regards to supporting the Capital Campaign. Without your support, we will not have the funds needed to address the multiple repairs our church building needs.

Since the end of April the congregation has been invited to participate in a few projects that have been sponsored by various groups within the church. On April 27th the Spring Fellowship Dinner was held to a growing number of people! We served nearly 150 meals, about 65 take outs and the remainder ate in. The Chicken Lombardy meal is always enjoyed by guests. Many thanks to the Fellowship Committee for their hard work and dedication to these events. All of the proceeds went to our church budget and after expenses that was over \$1,600. I want to personally thank each and every member of this congregation who supported our efforts. Unfortunately, the number of guests always outweighs the number of members who attend. I would love to see that change come fall.

A couple of weeks later, St. Paul's Women of the ELCA sponsored our first-ever Penny Auction. Most of us were novices at putting on such an event and had no idea how popular it would be! Doors opened at 6pm and by 5pm we had folks lining up at the door! We quickly realized that we were grossly unprepared for the crowd that was about to come! We hustled to set up more tables and every folding chair we had We encircled the fellowship hall with seating! We had a diverse group of people who attended and bought tickets and won many great prizes! We are thankful to Thrivent for the \$250 Action Team Grant they gave to help defer any expenses that was secured by Lisa Bodnar. We also want to thank the many members who provided some very nice prizes! There were a lot of very happy

people as they left that evening! (There were also many tired women and a few men who worked during that week to make it happen.) One-half of the proceeds of the Auction went to our church budget and the other one-half is being used for Biennial Convention Scholarships for our women to attend the convention at Camp Calumet in October 2024. The total income from the event was over \$2,200. Thank you again.

In the midst of the previous two events, Ethan Schaller presented his Senior Confirmation Class Project to the congregation. As a class of one, we quickly realized that we would have to reach out to the congregation to help with his "Blessing Bags for the Homeless." And help you did! The outpouring of support was pretty overwhelming to us! Ethan set a goal to make about 15 bags but once all was said and done, we ended up with 22 Blessings Bags. There are a whole lot of extras that will be taken to the Gathering Place where people in need can do laundry, take showers, get counselling, and more. These gifts will be used for a long time to come. Ethan, Max and Doug Harrel, David Little, and I stuffed bags with personal care products, water, tee shirts, snacks, and love. Thanks to all who helped make this project possible.




