Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

As most of you are aware by now, we have an ongoing Capital Campaign in place. Some of you may not know the reason we are doing this.

The reason is simple: to meet our most basic obligations, we need a significant boost to our flow of income. We have two specific needs. The first is increased income to meet our regular expenses without draining our investments, and second, we need to find the resources to do some major and necessary repairs to our building.

I hope we can think of this as a legacy. In the late 1800's a group of German Lutherans gave unsparingly to create St. Paul's in downtown Torrington. They envisioned a community of faith rooted in God's grace to bless their own families and any who would come after them. In the late 1960s the congregation had outgrown their building, and they had no room to expand. So again, without reserve, they labored and donated to build our present facility. Their expansion was spurred by growing families and a major influx of immigrants from Europe in the 1950s. Once again, they saw an opportunity to build upon the foundation that had been bequeathed to them by the original members of St. Paul's. They erected this prominent and beautiful space to worship, study, and join in fellowship. Besides these basic functions of a parish, the design and location of the new building stood, and stands, as a striking witness to the presence and power of our Lord.

Now it is our turn. We treasure and need this property for the ministries we share, including our own worship needs, our Christian Education obligations, our Fellowship gatherings, our Hilltop ministry, our hospitality to the Farmers' Market, Friendly Hands Food Bank, the Sharing Garden, the Korean Church, the Connecticut Yankee Chorale, the Red Cross, and more. We are known all around the Torrington area as an active and caring Christian congregation. May it ever be so.


But we have old plumbing, some leaks in the roof, some barely functional AC and some newer needs like updated security and tech needs. Lawn care, snow plowing, staff salaries and general utilities and insurance are all obligations we must meet. If the Capital Campaign – our request of the membership to do what they can to boost our income – does not yield our goal, we will have only a few less attractive options. One would be to draw down our investments. If we continue to do that, we will run out of money in about 6 years. After that, our future is dismal. Or we could take out a loan, which, of course, would need to be repaid, adding to our expenses.

Let us be like those who sacrificed to found St. Paul's, and those who responded again to build our present space. Let us look to the future with confidence and trust, and a

commitment to being a flourishing community of grace for our own families and our wider neighbors. Let us see this as a time to establish a strong and faithful legacy in the name and Spirit of Christ.

Finance





Dear Brother and Sisters in Christ,

I would like to take this opportunity to review our shortfall and how it is calculated. We take our budgeted Sunday offering plus what is needed from investments to balance the budget. This is the needed amount reflected on our Sunday slide. We then show what was actually received in our Sunday offerings. This figure is deducted from the budgeted figure. As reported on Sunday, June 16, we are showing a shortfall of approximately \$40,000. We reflect it this way because in reality, our Sunday offerings should be sufficient to cover our expenses. As you can see, it does not.

Fortunately, due to the generous giving of our committees, some members, and our contracts with the cell tower and parking lot, we have been able to offset the shortfall. As of Sunday, June 16th, we have received the following:

Capital Campaign \$8724.14 Fellowship committee \$1667.20 Grinder sales \$1749.21 Hilltop bingo fundraiser \$690 WELCA (Penny Auction) \$1138 Sharing Garden \$250 Thrivent Choice \$207 Cell tower \$7305 Parking Lot \$4598 Festival Offerings \$2370 Other Income \$7305 Use of Facilities \$7160

The above amounts equal \$43,163.55. It is because of the efforts of the above committees and members of our congregation that have given to the Capital Campaign, or donated in other ways, that we have not had to take any funds out of investments so far this year. We should all be very thankful for their efforts and praise God for their commitment to his Church.

As we are all aware, the Capital Campaign is not producing the monies for which we had hoped. If you recall, at the budget meeting, we agreed to a Capital Campaign of \$200,000. \$100,000 was to offset the deficit and the other \$100,000 was for the buildings much needed repairs. To date, we have only raised \$8724.14. I ask that we all pray mightily for the success of the campaign.

I also want to share with you that we now can accept credit/debit cards for purchasing fundraising tickets such as the fellowship dinners, concert series, items for sale, and so forth. We will be utilizing the Square that committees will have access to when running a fundraiser or selling tickets. If interested in using the Square, please see Rachel in the office. To pay for the initial units, we would like each committee to donate towards the cost. It comes to just over \$100 per committee. The money will come from the 25% the committee donates to the operating budget after a fundraiser. If your committee does not want to participate in using the square, please let me know and we will not charge your committee.






